Welcome the Word.

Elements of the parable

Mark 4:8-9 And other seeds fell into good soil and produced grain, growing up and increasing and yielding thirtyfold and sixtyfold and a hundredfold." ⁹ And he said, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

- Seed falling
- Good soil receiving
- Seed producing
 - Growing up
 - Increasing
 - Yielding

Ears to hear: "involves surrender of proud self-reliance and submission to God "1

Explanation of the parable

Mark 4:20 But those that were sown on the good soil are the ones who hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirtyfold and sixtyfold and a hundredfold.

Luke 8:15 As for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bear fruit with patience.

- Hear the Word
- Accept the Word

"He is neither hard, shallow nor preoccupied."2

Bear fruit: 30x, 60x, & 100x

Q: Have you shifted your allegiance to Jesus Christ? If not, say "Yes" to Jesus today. If so, the question becomes, "How do I continue growing in welcoming the Word?"

Practical reversal of the previous three responses

- I) Be quick to hear, slow to speak James 1:19-21 Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; ²⁰ for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. ²¹ Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls.
- 2) Take your thoughts captive with God's Word. Bit by bit, you will grow out of being dominated by fragile feelings. You'll still struggle, but now you can win 2 Corinthians 10:5 We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ,
- 3) Step by step, make room for Jesus in every room of your life.
 - Cares of this world: Maximize your weekend by prioritizing church connection.
 - Deceitfulness of riches: Start giving. Start somewhere. Work towards the tithe.
 - Desires for other things: Can I live without this *item/stuff*? How long can I live without it?

Psalm 4:7 You have put more joy in my heart than they have when their grain and wine abound.

- 2) Do I still grieve over sin or excuse it?
- 3) Am I a quick forgiver?
- 4) Am I growing in love?
- 5) Am I governed by God's Word?
